2. To appoint Chang Lee LLP, Chartered Accountants, as the auditors of the Company for the ensuing year, at a remuneration to be fixed by the directors.

All proposals were approved by the shareholders. The proposals are described in detail in the Company’s definitive proxy statement filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission on May 13, 2011. The results of each voting proposal were as follows:

Vancouver, BC—Lexaria Corporation (LXP-OTCBB) (LXX-CNSX) (the "Company" or "Lexaria") announces that at its AGM on June 17th all resolutions passed with an overwhelming number of votes cast for each resolution.

On June 17, 2011, the company had its annual general meeting. Certain motions were approved and adopted:

- Election of Chris Bunka, Bal Bhullar and David DeMartini as directors, approved by a shareholder vote with 5,535,524 votes for and 10,275 votes against;
- Ratification of the continued appointment of the independent, registered public accounting firm, approved by shareholder vote with 6,314,288 votes for, 50,613 abstaining, and nil votes against.
